16.13 a) Further to §16.7¹, and notwithstanding §16.12, a candidate who, by the end of the course, requires an improved assessment result in order to complete a minimum graduating undergraduate non-honours curriculum in that academic session, shall normally be afforded the opportunity described in §16.8² irrespective of the result obtained on completion of the course. The entitlement to reassessment in courses where the threshold grade has been achieved at the first attempt shall be limited to no more than 60 credits. This entitlement shall be limited to courses totalling no more than 60 credit points.

b) On completion of the reassessment, the Notwithstanding §16.12, 3 such a candidate shall be awarded the number of grade points corresponding to the grade achieved in the final course result following reassessment or, if higher, that corresponding to the grade achieved in the original assessment for a total of no more than 60 credits. This entitlement applies regardless of the basis on which the student was permitted reassessment.
